

HISTORY OF AMOS ASAY *Filed 25 Feb 1985 Read Dec. 9, 1987.*

Amos Asay 11th child and the tenth son of Joseph Asay and Sarah Ann Pedrick was born the 29th day of March 1860 in Trenton County, New Jersey. He was just a babe in arms when the family started for the west, arriving in Salt Lake City, Utah the 14th of September 1860. Amos was not quite six month old, and while crossing the plains the party was without water and the baby cried until he could cry no longer. No water or green growth could be found, so his mother had them bring her cactus which she cut and held to the baby's swollen tongue. Enough moisture oozed out to help the babe until water could be found. Amos's mother Sarah Ann Asay must have been a very brave person to leave a good home with a family of eleven children and to suffer the hardships while crossing the plains.

The family lived on the Jordan River south of Salt Lake City, when his father Joseph and sons were called along with many others to go to the Muddy Mission. Amos being the youngest and his mother stayed in the City, so she could take a course in mid-wifery from a doctor Anderson who lived here.

Later he and his mother joined his father and brothers on the Muddy. Amos was ten years old when the colonists left the Muddy Mission; to make the long and tiresome Journey to Long Valley in southern Utah. To get around the mountains meant going to St. George Utah; then eighty miles over a difficult sandy desert southeast into Arizona past Pipe Springs and north past Kanab Utah, then on for twenty miles over more deep drifting sand to the end of their quest Long Valley.

The family settled in Winsor, later called Mt. Carmel, Utah. The Asay family soon found a place for a ranch and took up a summer residence on a creek over the mountain from Long Valley, and later known as Asay Creek. Amos did a lot of fishing in the Asay Creek and caught some real nice ones.

After the death of his father Joseph Asay, Amos and his brother Theodore were found at Asay Creek with their mother according to the 1880 Census that was taken, the place was listed as Hillsdale Precinct, as Hillsdale had only one school at that time. Amos was listed as 20 years son of Sarah Ann Asay single and Stock farmer.

2. Amos lived at Asay Creek after his marriage to Sarepta Earl Asay the 15th of May 1885 and operated both a single mill and a saw mill there.

Later Amos and his family left for Green River. The boys tried to drive the cattle across the river, but the cattle did not want to go across the river, the boys tried to urge and push them on, in doing so the boys slid off their horses; their mother became frightened and upset; but the boys grabbed the horses tails, urging them across. They finally got all the horses to swim across with them and the cattle.

The family remained there for two years, but due to the poor health of the mother, they returned to Asay Creek, living on the Ilglestead place where they raised cattle and horses.

From Asay Creek they went to Riverside near Blackfoot Idaho, and then to Leweston Montana, where Amos did contract work on the Canals. Finally in 1906 Amos moved family his son to Lovell Wyoming, where several of his brothers had moved. Amos had a good way with youngsters, who often followed him around. He also held the idea that children were all born good, but it took a lifetime for the parents to ruin them.

Amos Asay died in Lovell Wyoming six years later on the 25th day of Oct. 1936. His wife Sarepta Earl Asay died the 24th of Feb. 1930 in Lovell Wyoming.

I, RAMONA, THE YOUNGEST DAUGHTER OF AMOS ASAY WRITE VERY LITTLE ABOUT MY FATHER. I DON'T REMEMBER MUCH ABOUT HIM AS I WAS A SMALL CHILD WHEN HE AND MY MOTHER DIVORCED.

DADDY AND MAMA WORKED VERY HARD DURING THE DEPRESSION YEARS OF THE LATE TWENTIES AND EARLY THIRTIES. THERE WAS VERY LITTLE WORK THEN SO DADDY WORKED ON THE ROADS AND WITH THE SHEEP.

DADDY WAS FUNNY. HE ALWAYS WORE A HAT. HE NEVER TOOK IT OFF EXCEPT TO SLEEP. WHEN HE WOKE UP HE ALWAYS PUT HIS HAT ON, AND THAT WAS EVEN BEFORE GETTING DRESSED, AND THEN WHEN HE GOT UNDRESSED FOR BED HIS HAT WAS THE LAST THING HE TOOK OFF.

DADDY SMOKED BULLDERM (TOBACCO). HE ALWAYS CARRIED A LITTLE POUCH IN HIS SHIRT POCKET. WHENEVER HE WANTED A CIGARETTE, HE WOULD TAKE THE LITTLE POUCH OF TOBACCO OUT AND POUR IT INTO A SMALL PIECE OF WHITE PAPER THEN ROLL IT AROUND THE TOBACCO, THEN HE WOULD LICK IT SO IT WOULD STICK TOGETHER THEN LIGHT IT UP AND SMOKE IT. JUST AS SOON AS HE WAS FINISHED WITH ONE HE WOULD ROLL ANOTHER. I DIDN'T LIKE DADDY TO SMOKE AND I HATED THE SMELL OF IT. I THINK IT TOOK ALOT OF PRACTICE TO HOLD THE PAPER WITH TWO FINGERS, POUR IN THE BULLDERM THEN ROLL IT UP.

DADDY MADE SOME WINE. ONE NIGHT HE OPENED A BOTTLE AND IT BLEW UP AND THE WINE FLEW ALL OVER THE WALLS AND CEILING. THE WINE NEVER DID COME OFF, BUT EVERYONE HAD A GOOD LAUGH OVER IT.

ONCE WHEN IT WAS RAINING AND THUNDERING REAL HARD, I WAS AFRAID AND COVERED UP WITH THE BLANKETS IN MAMAS BEDROOM. DADDY CAME IN AND TOOK ME OUT ON THE PORCH. HE HELD ME IN HIS ARMS TO SHOW ME THE RAIN AND THUNDER WOULDN'T HURT ME. I WAS NEVER AFRAID AFTER THAT.

THAT IS THE LAST TIME I REMEMBER MY FATHER BEING AT HOME WITH US.

DADDY CAME TO SEE US. I REMEMBER SEEING HIM ONCE WHEN I WAS AT A BROTHER OR SISTERS HOME HE PUT HIS ARM AROUND ME BUT I DON'T REMEMBER WHAT WE TALKED ABOUT. I WAS ABOUT TWELVE THEN AND I NEVER SAW HIM ALIVE AGAIN. WILLIS HAS THIS TO SAY ABOUT DADDY. DADDY WAS A BIG MAN, ABOUT 180 POUNDS. HE WAS 5 FOOT 10 OR 11. HE HAD BLUE OR GREEN EYES. HE IS THE FOURTH SON AND CHILD OF JEROME ASAY AND NANCY MEEKS. THERE WERE ELEVEN BROTHERS AND SISTERS. DADDY HAD DARK BROWN HAIR BUT MOSTLY BALD ON TOP. HE WAS A VERY HANDSOME MAN.

DADDY HAD VERY LITTLE SCHOOLING AS HE WOULD RATHER BE OUTDOORS.

DADDY LOVED HUNTING, FISHING AND RIDING HORSES. HE WAS AN EXPERT WITH HORSES. HE WAS AN EXPERT AT SPEARING FISH.

DADDY WAS A HARD WORKER AND GENEROUS TO A FAULT. HE WAS KIND AND LOW SPOKEN, AND EVERYONE WAS HIS FRIEND. HE WAS HOME VERY LITTLE, BUT HE ALWAYS SAW THAT WE GOT APPLES, POTATOES, AND FOOD THAT WE NEEDED.

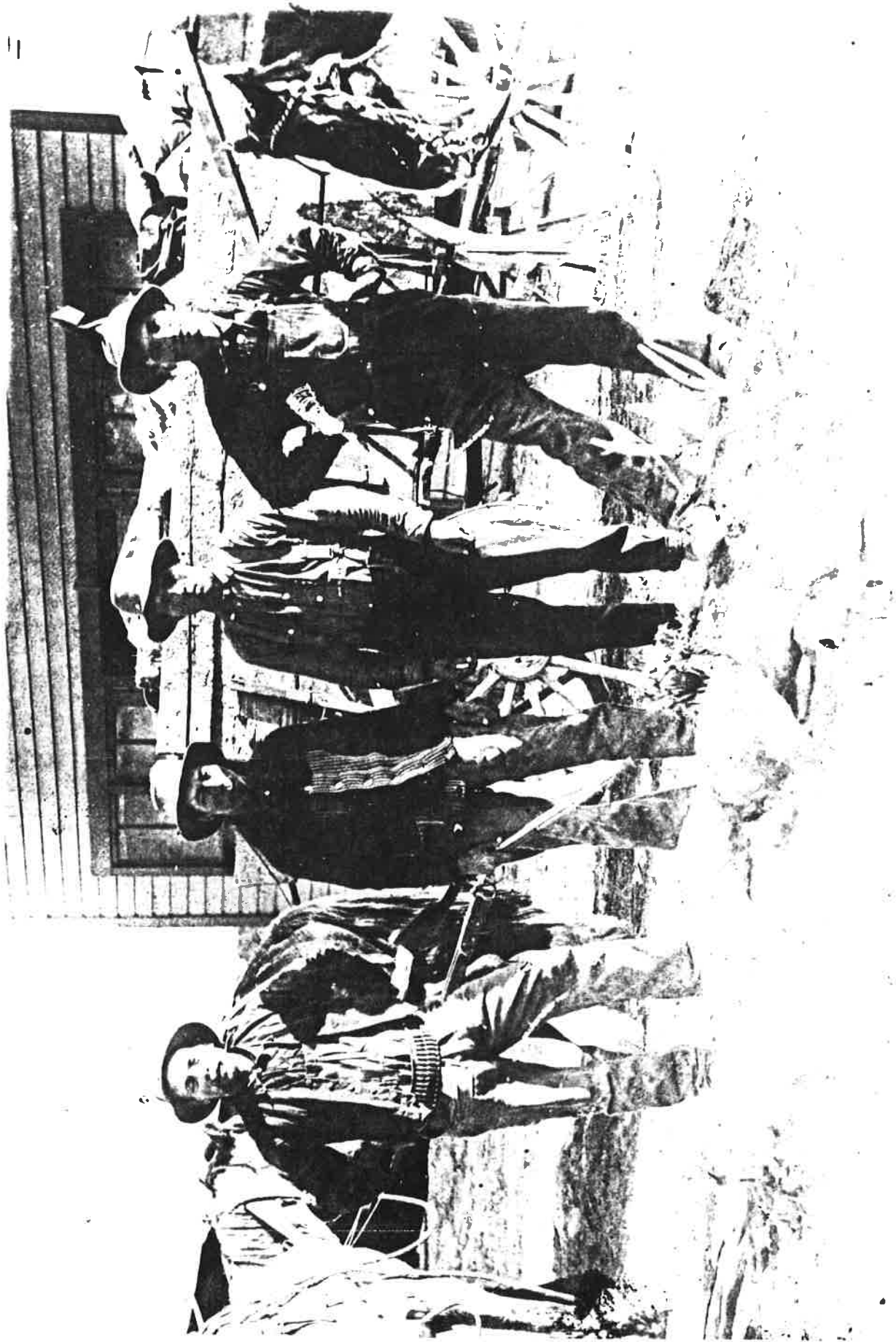
AT THE HOLIDAYS WE ALWAYS HAD A TURKEY AND PINENUTS THAT DADDY BROUGHT US. SISTER EMERALD REMEMBERS WHEN DADDY STAYED WITH HER. BONNIE, HER DAUGHTER, WAS JUST TWO YEARS OLD. DADDY LIKED HIS COFFEE EVERY DAY. SHE DIDN'T KNOW HOW HOW TO MAKE COFFEE. DIXIE LIVED DOWN THE STREET SO SHE WOULD MAKE THE COFFEE AND BRING IT DOWN FOR DAD. EMERALD ALWAYS FELT BAD BECAUSE HE WOULD HAVE TO DRINK IT COLD. EMERALD HAD A COAL STOVE AND HAD TO BUILD A FIRE BEFORE YOU COULD COOK. SHE SAID DADDY NEVER DID COMPLAIN ABOUT ANYTHING. HE WAS JUST HAPPY TO BE WITH HER. SHE DIDN'T SEE HIM MUCH AFTER THAT. HE WENT BACK TO CASTLE DALE. DADDY DIED ON THE 7 DAY OF DECEMBER 1944 of PNEUMONIA, IN PRICE, CARBON COUNTY, UTAH AND BURRIED AT CASTLE DALE, EMERY COUNTY, UTAH.

DURING THE YEARS THAT DADDY AND MAMA WERE MARRIED, DADDY WORKED IN THE COAL MINES IN MORELAND. HE WAS A MINER AND ALSO WORKED FOR HIS FATHER WHO SUPPLIED THE LUMBER FOR THE COAL MINE. ONCE WHEN DADDY WAS WORKING HE WAS CRUSHED. HE HAD A COLAPSED LUNG AND OTHER INJURIES. HE SURVIVED. BUT IT WAS VERY SERIOUS FOR A LONG TIME. DADDY ALSO HELPED MINE THE LARGEST PEICE OF COAL THAT EVER CAME OUT OF THE MINE AND IT WAS IN THE STATE CAPITOL BUILDING IN SALT LAKE CITY FOR A LONG TIME.

DADDY WAS VERY ILL WITH CANCER. HE WAS IN THE HOSPITAL FOR SIX WEEKS. MAMA STAYED AT THE HOSPITAL AND TOOK CARE OF HIM UNTIL HE RECOVERED. HIS FATHER JEROME BOUGHT A DAIRY FARM SO DADDY WENT TO WORK DELIVERING MILK FOR HIM WITH HIS BROTHER. WHEN JEROME SOLD THE FARM DADDY WENT BACK TO WORK IN THE COAL MINE.

Cloie Burgess was born on the 9th day of August 1892 in Huntington, Emery Co. Utah to Mary Ann Davis and William Harrison Burgess. She was number 4 of 10 Children.

Cloie attended school until the eighth grade when she had to quit to help her mother care for her younger brothers and sisters. She met Amos when Grandpa Jerome moved from Vernal, Utah. He set up a tent on Grandpa Burgess property in Huntington in the year of 1909. Cloie was 19 and Amos was 26. They were married on November 7, 1910 in Castle Dale, Utah.

They lived much of their young lives in Hiawatha. Amos worked in the Coal mines in Moreland. They lived in tents when houses weren't available. They had 6 children while living in camps. Later in their lives they lived in Price. Amos and Cloie divorced after Cloie moved to Salt Lake City in the year 1937.

Cloie remarried in 1942 to Alfred A. McIntosh. They moved to Richmond, California in 1946.

Alfred died in 1959. Cloie remained a widow until her death in July of 1961.

Cloie died of a Subdural Hematoma caused by a fall hitting her head on a chest of drawer. She lived in Alameda, California at that time.

Cloie said this about Amos. He was very handsome, stubborn, and a hard worker.

Cloie was a beautiful and talented person. She did beautiful Crocheting and sewing for many people besides her own family. She sang and played the Organ by ear.

Amos never remarried.

9 Children were born to Amos and Cloie. 9 are still living.

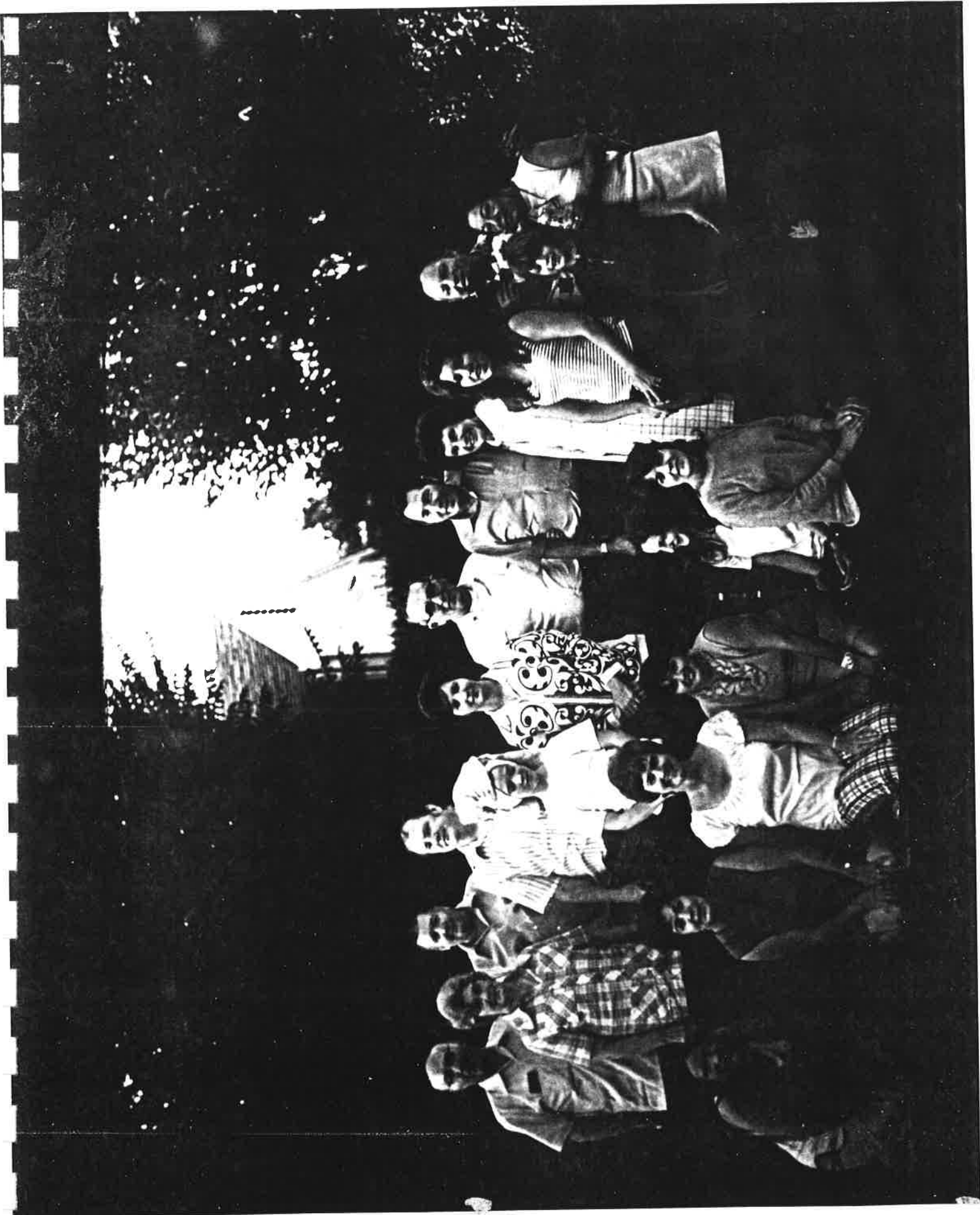

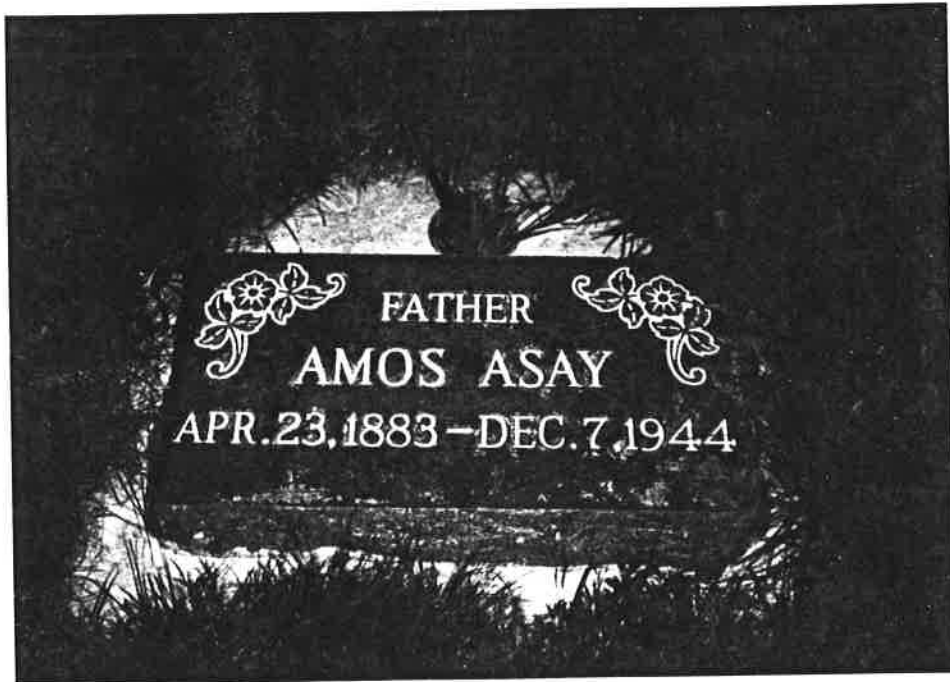
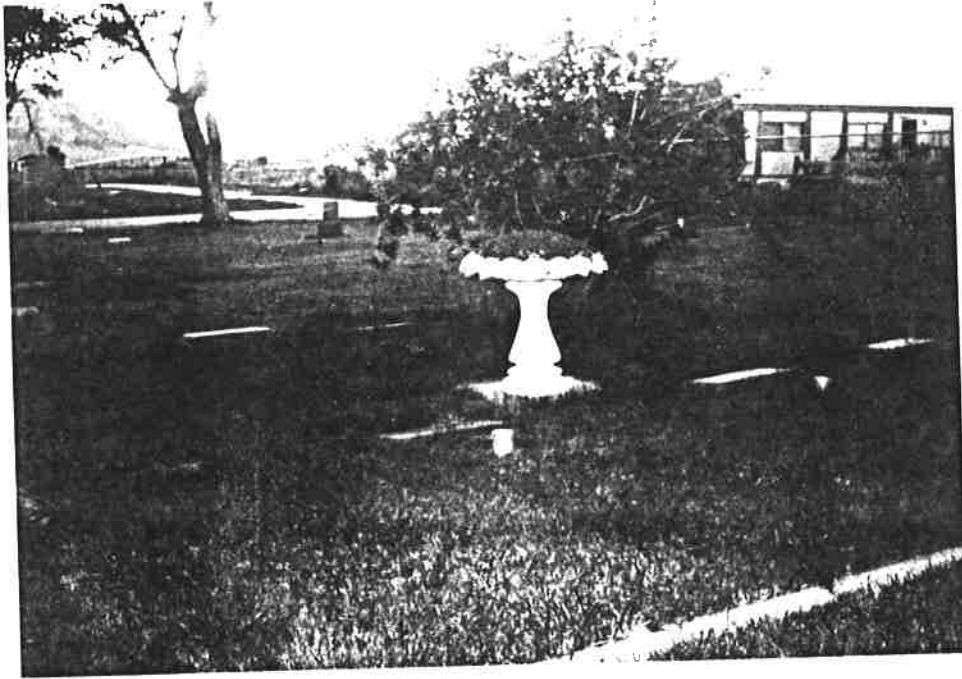
