My dad, a proud father of three sons. He is the first of four brothers and one sister.

Born in Oakland, California, November, 12, 1952 to Richard Louis Fielder and Zora Johansen Fielder. My parents were both in the U.S. Navy at this time.

We re-located in Castle Dale, Utah in 1959 where I attended first grade at Castle Dale Elementary. We attended the third through sixth grades at the Orangeville Elementary.

During this period I spend most of my spare time doing chores, milking two cows every day and every night for my Grandparents. Summer months were spend moving cattle from Buckhorn to East Mountain and generally other farming duties.

I attended South Emery Jr. High where I played baseball. They didn't have a football program at that time.

I attended Emery County High from 1969-1972, where I was student body Vice-President, and President of FFA Chapter. I played baseball and football during high school and also worked at Tracy's Conoco.

After I left high school, I attended college at St. George and then in Price at the College of Eastern Utah.
