Hales and Reeds, South Willow canyon (camping ground) up above Grantsville. My Granddad talk's about this place all the time he said it was so pretty he would like to go there a gine some time, like he did 40 years ago.

Every summer Earl Hales and the Reed's would spend two weeks in south Willow canyon camping for vacation. (up above Grantsville).

"It was a very pretty place to stay there was a stream with little fish in it (that you can fish) and all kinds of animals jumping over the stream and a round it, you can also exploring on this narrow trails were there were rocks and all different kind of trees. "That is what my granddad would say.

There were 10 Reed's and 12 Hales when they would get tired of all they activity they would come back for some of they grandpas engine cooking that they didn't think was very good but they didn't dare to tale him . So they served For three more days of his cooking. thin he finally started to use the fire "YA" they all said.

It finale got dark there favorite time of the day now they can play no bears are out to night They would always run off so the adults would haft to get them back "I Don't want to go back" they would say and they were all sad.

When It came time to go to bed my great grandpa would always tell this story how my granddad would all wise make my Great Grandma sleep at the door of the tent, She was a big woman so if the bears came in at night to eat them, by the time they got threw eating my great Grandma they would be to full to eat the rest of the family.

After the long and fun two weeks they would be headed home .The boys would have to sit in the back of the car so every time that a tire would go out they would put on the spare and then fites the other tire in the back of the car and put a patch on it then when a another tire would go out they would put the fites one on then fites the flat one. "Was that a long ride or what" they would all wise say .

Rachelle Tanner Erickson (Great Grandma) This is a story my
Great Grandma tells about growing up with her sister Jessie.

I was ether seven or eight years of age when I ruined my lovely white eyelet embroidery dress that my cosine Fern Tanner handed down to me. Fran was the youngest child of Uncle Stewarts and ant Jessie Tanner, and I got her clothing when she outgrew them. This dress of course was my sunday dress And I was sops to change it right after Sunday school. One Sunday I didn't change I cut threw the field ten acres of my Uncle Cauncy, ten acres of my mothers field, ten acres of my Uncle Owen. In this orchard there was an interesting looking bird nest in an apple tree. I only wanted to peak in the nest to see if there were any eggs. I climbed the tree, never did see inside the nest, fell out of the tree, cut my arm on a pruned branch that was slat was and sharp. a chunk of mussel cut in a circular hanging position. I was so worried about staining and taring my dress and climbing on sunday. I managed to get home blood-soaked and crying. I am unable but my sister, Jessie was the only one home. Anyway Jessie rapped a dish towel tight around my arm and lead me one and one-half to the home of Dr. Schultz. dr. Schultz. asked some men who were loitering in front of the closed store to come in hold me down on the table will he sowed my arm. When he was dun Jessie dragged me one and one-half miles back home.

In 1947 four of the of the brother and sisters died along with
there mom Abigail Kruyer Talor. All the people that were left were
Mary Rosina and Jane Zerilda Backer. Crossing the plains when they
were only 8 and 12.

They finale made it to Grantsville in 1851 When they got
settled. Jane became the 2 wife if Emery Barrus. Jane got married
in 1857 Had 7 kids one was Emaline abigat.

Jane died in 1895. Before Jane died she gave Emaline the
handed panted dish set from England. But all that was left was a
pickle dish.

Emaline said "yes" to marrying Martin Henry Tanner in 1879. In
Grantsville they had 11 kids. Rachelle Tanner was one of them.

She said "I do" to Georgey Erickson in the Salt Lake Temple in
1918.

Dec 24 1920 Iola Reed (my grandma) was born then 30 years
latter She married Jim Reed (my grendad) in 1950.

When my Grandma was married she got the pickle dish and she
hopes it will go on for generation to generation.

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
